

## SIX SIGNS TO WATCH FOR:



1. A WHITE REFLECTION IN THE PUPIL



2. A SQUINT, WHERE ONE EYE LOOKS IN OR OUT



3. A RED, SORE OR SWOLLEN EYE WITHOUT INFECTION



4. A CHANGE IN THE COLOUR OF THE IRIS



5. AN ABSENCE OF RED EYE IN ONE PUPIL



6. A DETERIORATION IN THE CHILD'S SIGHT

## Think something might be wrong?

If you see one or more of these signs appear, be sure to get the child's eyes checked urgently as these symptoms can indicate several other eye conditions. A GP or local optician can do the initial fundal (red) reflex test, and refer you to a specialist if necessary.
